Session 1 - What is musical theatre?			
Kapow Year 5 Musical theatre music Lesson 1			

• An introduction to the concept of musical theatre; children learn about its history and how it has changed over time. They will put

different types of musicals in chronological order.

Session 2 - Character or action song

Kapow Year 5 Musical theatre music Lesson 2

• Children will learn to identify character and action songs and develop their understanding of the role of different songs within a musical production.

Session 3 - Create your own musical

Kapow Year 5 Musical theatre music Lesson 3

- Children will apply what they have learned and plan their own musical theatre scene, including a song, dance and acting.
- You might choose to add additional lessons to this before Lesson 4.

Session 4 - Rehearsing my musical

Kapow Year 5 Musical theatre music Lesson 4

• Once they have planned their musical, pupils decide on the roles of individuals within their group and rehearse their scene.

Session 5 - Performing my musical
