I can name the capital of France immediately and three other well-known French cities if I am given an opportunity to look at a map first. I can name one other country where they speak French in the world. I can tell you my name, count to ten and how I am feeling in French with the help of an adult or the PowerPoint used in class. 	 Je Peux I can name up to five common French verbs/activities. I can also spell up to five of these verbs accurately. I can match up to five verbs/activities to their picture easily, and attempt more if I have time to remind myself of the language first. I can say I am able to do some of these activities in French by using je peux.
 Petit Chaperon Rouge I can listen and follow the entire story of Little Red Riding Hood in French and understand most of what I hear. I can remember nearly all of the words for the picture cards in French and find it easier when I have a word bank, an adult or a partner to prompt me. I can remember and spell three parts of the body we covered in class.
